ADMISSION BY GRE Graduate Record Exam

Concordia Law School of Law is excited to announce that we have launched a pilot admissions program and are now accepting the Graduate Record Exam (GRE) for applicants seeking admission to the Fall 2020 entering first year class.

HOW TO APPLY:

Applicants who would like to be considered for law school admission based on their GRE scores should complete the following steps:

STEP 1: SUBMIT YOUR GRE SCORE

If you have taken the GRE within the past five years, log into your ETS account (www.ets.org) and select Concordia University School of Law as a recipient of your GRE results. The ETS Institutional Code for Concordia Law is 4821. Applicants must submit all valid GRE scores from the last five years.

If you have yet to take the GRE, register for the GRE today by visiting the Educational Testing Services (ETS) at www.ets.org. During your GRE registration process, select Concordia University School of Law as a recipient school and enter Concordia Law's ETS Code (4821).

STEP 2: REGISTER WITH LSAC

All applicants for admission to Concordia University School of Law must register with the Law School Admission Council (LSAC) at (www.lsac.org). This LSAC registration process ensures your completed application for admission, academic-transcripts, letters of recommendation, personal statement, resume and other addenda will be submitted to Concordia Law.
