



**CHARACTER & FITNESS REQUIREMENTS**

Your official student file must remain current, including any changes in response to questions about your character and fitness for law school and the legal profession. Discrepancies discovered or failure to disclose information in this section could result in withdrawal of your offer of admission, dismissal after matriculation to the School of Law, or rejection of your application to take a state bar exam.

**If your answer has changed to "yes" to any of the character and fitness questions due to incidents that occurred after your admission, or if you did not initially disclose any information related to one of these questions, a written addendum must be submitted immediately to the Office of Student Affairs.**

**Also, if further information to one of these questions becomes available while you are a law student at Concordia University, it is your responsibility to complete an updated addendum.**

**Finally, because character and fitness requirements vary by state, you are strongly advised to determine at the earliest opportunity the requirements for the state(s) in which you intend to practice.** Detailed information can be found in the Comprehensive Guide to Bar Admissions, published by the National Conference of Bar Examiners ([www.ncbex.org](http://www.ncbex.org)), or directly from the Bar jurisdiction(s) in question ([www.ncbex.org](http://www.ncbex.org) or [www.barexam.org](http://www.barexam.org)).

**AMENDMENT INSTRUCTIONS**

1. Include your name and the question number(s) that is/are being addressed.
2. Include a full description statement of any and all incidents, including the date and location (city/state) of the incident, a full account of the outcome, including, when applicable, the location of the court with jurisdiction over said matter.
3. Include any factors you would like included when consideration is given to the incident in question such as age, circumstances leading to incident, etc.
4. If you did not initially disclose this incident and it occurred prior to the receipt of your offer of admission, please provide an explanation regarding why you did not initially disclose this information.

<b>1. Have you ever been cited, arrested, indicted for, or charged with any violation of criminal law?</b> In answering this question, include all incidents as a juvenile or adult, no matter how minor the charge, whether guilty or not, whether exonerated or not, whether sentencing was withheld, excluding only non-moving traffic violations which resulted in a penalty not exceeding \$25.
