

ADMISSION BY PERFORMANCE

Admission by Performance (ABP) is a four-week program for promising law school candidates comprising two courses: Introduction to Contracts and Introduction to Legal Discourse & Analysis. Both courses will be delivered either in-person or through live-streaming.

In-Person: For local candidates or candidates interested in relocating to Boise for the program, classes will be held at the Concordia University School of Law campus in downtown Boise, Idaho.

Live-Streamed: Utilizing a live-streaming delivery system, candidates outside of Boise will be able to participate in the program. Course materials and the professor will be accessible through this web space allowing the professor and candidates to interact during class.

MAY 29 – JUNE 25, 2018

The ABP program will include eight class periods and a final exam for each course, with each class period meeting for approximately three hours.

Once grading for each course has concluded, the Admission Committee will meet to determine who will be admitted from the ABP program as a J.D. candidate for the Fall 2018 term.

REQUIREMENTS

To be considered for the ABP program, interested candidates are required to complete an application for admission through LSAC (lsac.org) and have it reviewed by the Admission Committee for character & fitness and academic eligibility.

Candidates approved for the program will need to submit an enrollment deposit by Tuesday, May 1 to secure their space in the program.

Note: *ABP is considered a pre-admission program; therefore students who matriculate at Concordia Law (or any other ABA-approved law school) will not receive course credit toward their J.D. degree program.*

COST

\$2,400 – payment due by Friday, June 1, 2018

Note: *course materials, such as books, are an additional cost.*

ABP SCHOLARSHIP

Students who matriculate into the J.D. program at Concordia Law will receive a \$1,000/year scholarship.

COURSES

Introduction to Legal Discourse & Analysis

T/TH, May 29 – June 25, 5–8 pm MDT

The first half of this course will focus on learning how to read cases critically and will incorporate extensive practice of case briefing. The second half of the course will focus on rule structures, rule-based and analogical reasoning, and rule synthesis with the main goal to ensure candidates understand the process of analysis.

Introduction to Contracts

W, May 30 | F, June 1 | M/W, June 4–25, 5–8 pm MDT

This course will incorporate formative assessment of the candidates' ability to grasp the principles that govern the formation and performance of legally enforceable promises, focusing on concepts of the offer, acceptance and consideration for contract formation.
